Programs can be implemented at any point

between now and the end of the year, but many libraries choose to incorporate the program with their Veterans' Day programming. The State Library will be hosting a ceremony to kick off its tree dressing on November 9. The tree will remain up until 2013.

The Our Heroes' Tree Resource Guide for Indiana libraries was created by the Military Family Research Institute at Purdue University. This guide contains programming ideas, templates, marketing materials, ornamentmaking tips, and other items to help you implement the program. Whether your library is joining the program for the first time or is an OHT "veteran," the resource guide is designed to help you develop the very best program

Participating libraries are welcome to create their own programming for Our Heroes' Tree. Some past programs that have been implemented by libraries throughout Indiana include adopting a soldier or platoon, assisting military families to set up a family blog, patriotic crafting ideas for children, writing letters to veterans, and hosting workshops for veterans to interact with the community.

Our Heroes' Tree is a national initiative founded to recognize and honor sacrifices made by the families of current and past service members. The goal of the project to support the efforts of military members and their families while providing military related programming for all ages.
