The 2013 applications must be received by 4:00 PM EST on Friday, March 15th, 2013 and include the following opportunities for Indiana libraries and historical and cultural organizations:

- **Technology Grants**

- **Digitization Grants**
The theme for the [2013 Digitization Grant Program](#) is *The Indiana Bicentennial*. While adherence to the theme is not required, projects incorporating this theme are encouraged.
- **Ongoing Grant Opportunities**
More information about open deadline grant opportunities, including Innovative Library Technology grants and Information Access for the Unserved grants, will be available in January 2013

State Library Genealogy Named "Best State Website" by Family Tree

State Library Genealogy Named 2012 Best Website

Family Tree Magazine, America's #1 family history publication recently recognized the Indiana State Library Genealogy Collection among the "2012 Best State Websites." This is the second-consecutive year the State Library has received this designation. The [Genealogy Collection's website](#) offers several features and resources that can assist visitors with their family history research. The website highlights statewide indexes to marriages, deaths, biographies and newspapers, as well as vital records and indexes for each of Indiana's 92 counties.

The Genealogy Collection has developed over time to become one of the largest collections of family history information in the Midwest. In addition to its abundant online resources, the collection includes over 40,000 printed items as well as microfilmed federal census records, Indiana county records, passenger lists, military pension information and hundreds of CDs with family history information. The emphasis of the collection is on Indiana and bordering states, as well as eastern and southern states. Resources for Native American and African-American family history research are also available.

"We strive to build an online presence that complements the State Library's extensive Genealogy Collection," said Roberta L. Brooker, State Librarian, in a recent [press release](#). "We want family history researchers to understand what is available and how to utilize our Genealogy Collection via online resources, reference assistance or in-house and statewide programming."

Additional assistance is available for online researchers via the [Ask-A-Librarian](#) service, which offers phone, email and live chat options. The State Library also offers Family History Tours at least twice monthly, as well as several family history workshops. The State Library also brings workshops to local communities. The Big Read is a national program designed to revitalize the role of literature in American culture and to encourage reading for pleasure and enlightenment. Organizations selected to participate in The Big Read receive a grant, educational and promotional materials, and access to online training resources and opportunities. Approximately 75 organizations from across the country will be selected.

Letters About Literature Accepting Entries through Jan. 11, 2013

Entry forms for the '12-'13 Letters About Literature contest are now available on the [Indiana Center for the Book's website](#).  The national reading-writing competition, sponsored by the Center for the Book in the Library of Congress and Indiana Center for the Book, calls for entrants to write a personal letter to an author, living or dead, from any genre (fiction or nonfiction, contemporary or classic, etc.) explaining how that author's work changed the student's way of thinking about the world or their self.

All Indiana semifinalists will be invited to the Indiana Youth Literary Day & Awards Ceremony presented by the James & Madeleine McMullan Family Foundation on April 27, 2013. Participants will have the opportunity to engage in creative writing workshops presented by notable Hoosier young adult authors, and will be honored at ceremony following the day's activities. All semifinalists in attendance will receive free books and are invited to an exclusive book-signing reception following the ceremony. State contest finalists will receive a cash award and a plaque. First-place winners also advance to the national level competition and are eligible for the \$1,000 grand prize and runner-up cash prizes.

Letters About Literature is open to legal U.S. residents enrolled as a student in grades 4 -12 during 2012/2013 school year (note: only grades 9 &10 eligible for national prizes for Level 3). Entries must be postmarked by **January 11, 2013** for consideration.
