# Sculpture Dedicated in Honor of Martha Catt

The inscription below the sculpture states:

"Dedicated to children of all ages who love learning. This sculpture is a gift given in honor of Martha Catt from The Library Foundation and her many friends. April 15, 2012."

Over Catt's two-decade tenure as library director she oversaw the construction of a new 50,000 square foot building from a 1,400 square foot house. During this time the library experienced significant growth in its collections, programming and patron base. Later in her career, Catt was instrumental in the growth and development of the Evergreen Indiana Consortium, becoming the first Indiana library to use the Evergreen integrated library system. The consortium now includes nearly 100 libraries across the state. In July of 2010, Catt was presented with the Distinguished Hoosier Award on behalf of Governor Mitch Daniels.
