Over \$300,000 in LSTA Grants Awarded to Indiana Libraries

The Indiana State Library recently awarded LSTA Grants for Indiana \$150,000 in technology sub-grants to 23 Libraries

Indiana libraries. In all, the State Library

received 38 technology sub-grant

applications requesting \$316,726 in LSTA

funds. The 2012 LSTA technology grants will fund the purchase of mobile laptop labs, improved connectivity and networking infrastructure, eReaders and iPads, among other items. An additional six technology projects will also be made possible in part through a new partnership with Net Literacy. All projects involve the provision or replacement of public access computers.

Eleven more Indiana libraries received over \$154,000 in LSTA funds for digitization projects. The theme for the 2012 Digitization Grant Program is the approaching Indiana Bicentennial in 2016. Many of the awarded projects focus on materials with statewide significance related to the Statehood Bicentennial.

All LSTA applications were reviewed by members of the Indiana State Library Advisory Council and State Library staff. Applications for grant opportunities with rolling deadlines (Innovative Library Technology **Grant & Information Access for the Unserved Grant) are accepted** year round. Guidelines for 2013 technology and digitization grants will be released this fall.

Digital Bookmobile Making 2-Day Stop in Indiana this May

Digital Bookmobile **Coming to Indy!**

The **Digital Bookmobile** is scheduled to make its only stop in Indiana on Thursday, May 24 and Friday, May 25

at the Indianapolis Public Library. The 74-foot, 18-wheel tractor-trailer is visiting communities nationwide to promote downloadable eBooks, audiobooks, music, and video.

Sponsored by Overdrive, the Digital Bookmobile creates an engaging download experience around the host library's digital media collection and 'Virtual Branch' download website. The vehicle is equipped with broadband Internet-connected PCs, high-definition monitors, premium sound systems, and a variety of portable media players. Interactive computer stations give visitors an opportunity to search the digital media collection, use supported mobile devices, and sample eBooks, audiobooks, music, and video from the library.

Deadline Nears to Apply for Leadership Academy

Applications for the Indiana Library Leadership Academy (ILLA) are being accepted until **Sunday, May 13, 2012**. The application available online.

The State Library's Professional **Development Committee** established the Academy to prepare future library leaders for 21st-Century challenges. The inaugural 10-month academy will begin this July for a group of 50 cohorts with a five-day workshop at the Canyon Inn at McCormick's Creek State Park. The cost of the Academy is just \$150 (\$2,100 value) for participants thanks to a significant subsidy from the Indiana State Library.
