# Partnership Aims to Improve Computer Access in Indiana Libraries

The Indiana State Library has partnered with NetLiteracy.org, an organization

aimed at reducing the digital divide by

rehabbing donated computers, which

are then donated to schools, libraries and other community organizations. The computers are then used locally to teach computer and Internet skills and improve access to the Internet.

Net Literacy was founded by an Indiana middle school student in 2003, and today it remains a "student empowered" organization. The students set their own mission and priorities, write their own grants, and perform all of the volunteering and community services. In the past nine years, Net Literacy has increased computer access to over 170,000 individuals, repurposed over 20,000 computers.

The goals of this partnership is to make available a number of refurbished computers to public and school libraries in Indiana and enable them to replace slow and outdated public access computers and OPAC stations, and expand the number of public workstations.

These machines will all have 1GB ram, 40GB or larger hard drives, Ethernet cards, the Windows 7 operating system, antivirus software and will be delivered ready to be connected to the Internet. A limited number of monitors are also available; both flat screen and CRT models.

# INfo Express Prices Unchanged, Renewals Due May 15



User fees for the INfo Express delivery service contract will remain at current levels for the next service year (July 1,

2012 - June 30, 2013). Stable prices are welcome news given the rising transportation costs associated with gasoline prices. In addition to keeping prices low, the State Library will continue to subsidize one-day-a-week delivery service at \$75 for public, school, and academic libraries that meet the requirements of the INfo Express program.

As additional incentive to promote resource sharing throughout Indiana's library community, the State Library will continue to offer a second day of delivery at the subsidized rate of \$125 for the year, rather than the normal rate of \$450 per weekly stop. Eligible libraries include:

- Libraries currently receiving the additional day subsidy and have remained an active lender with OCLC or Evergreen;
- Libraries that are adding a day of services for the coming service year and are actives lender with OCLC or Evergreen;

# Four Days Remain to Apply for Leadership Academy

Applications for the Indiana Library Leadership Academy (ILLA) are being accepted until **Sunday, May 13, 2012**. The application available online.

The State Library's Professional Development Committee established the Academy to prepare future library leaders for 21st-Century challenges. The inaugural 10-month academy will begin this July for a group of 50 cohorts with a five-day workshop at the Canyon Inn at McCormick's Creek State Park. The cost of the Academy is just \$150 (\$2,100 value) for participants thanks to a significant subsidy from the Indiana State Library.
