Time is Running Out to Renew INfo Express Service

next service year (July 1, 2012 - June 30, 2013), but have yet to submit their renewal, must do so by July 30, 2012 to ensure eligibility for the special subsidized rate of \$125.00 per weekly stop (for the first one to two stops) and avoid late fees.

In addition to keeping prices low, the State Library has added an incentive to promote resource sharing throughout Indiana's library community. Any library INCREASING its weekly delivery days AND participating as an active lender through OCLC's WorldCat or as an Evergreen member library will be eligible for a discounted rate.

New Resources Coming to Enhanced INSPIRE Website



In addition to a sleeker INSPIRE interface and enhanced search functionality, INSPIRE users may soon notice the addition of two new useful resources. On July 1, INSPIRE will unveil Home Improvement Reference Center and Hobbies and Crafts Reference Center. Both Ebsco products can provide answers to many frequently asked questions in

public libraries.

Hobbies and Crafts Reference Center provides content for many of the most popular hobbies, sports and games. It has an interface that allows users to gain access to more than 450 books and magazines as well as more than 300 videos and manuals. The database divides hobbies into 8 separate groups, Arts & Crafts, Collecting, Electronics & Games, Home & Leisure, Model Building, Needlecrafts & Textiles, Outdoors & Nature, Scrapbooking & Paper Crafts.

Home Improvement Reference Center is designed to assist homeowners in do-it-yourself projects, as well as educate about general upkeep, home maintenance and remodeling projects. This database offers advice on hundreds of topics such as woodworking, plumbing, tiling, gardening, roofing, siding, remodeling and much more. In addition to thousands of articles, there are nearly 100 how-to videos for those who are visual learners.

Last month, the Greenwood community stepped up big for the "Save the Library" campaign. Residents, corporations and even Girl Scouts donated over \$20,000 to the library. A few weeks later, the Dollar General Literacy Foundation awarded a \$2,000 grant to Friends of the Greenwood Public Library. The money will benefit Furry Friends, a program that uses therapy dogs to help kids boost reading skills.

Next, GPL is planning to host one of the most anticipated fundraisers of the year. On October 18, long-time library supporter Coach Bob Knight will address a projected 3000-4000 Hoosier basketball fans at the Gathering Place in Greenwood. Adding local flavor to the event, Coach Knight will be joined by hometown heroes Tom and Dick Van Arsdale. The Van Arsdale twins grew up in Greenwood, were All-Americans at Indiana University and enjoyed All-Star careers in the National Basketball Association.

Tickets are already available for *A Knight to Remember*, which may raise as much as \$500,000 for the Friends of the Greenwood Public Library's newly established Hilda Van Arsdale Library Fund.
