# New INSPIRE Ready & Waiting for Test Drive



The new INSPIRE debuted early this week with an enhanced look and search functionality. The new 360 Search uses results clustering in order to speed up searches and better organize data. Results clustering separates search results by subtopics, dates, journals and authors so that search results are organized and easy to browse.

"We believe users will appreciate the new INSPIRE's more intuitive searching capabilities that now resembles popular online search engines," said Roberta L. Brooker, Indiana's State Librarian. "Now is a great time for Hoosiers that have not heard of INSPIRE to test drive this complete virtual library that is accessible from their home, school or work computer."

In addition to the new functionality and look, please be sure to check out three new databases now featured on INSPIRE. Hobbies and Crafts Reference Center provides content for many of the most popular hobbies, sports and games. It has an interface that allows users to gain access to more than 450 books and magazines as well as more than 300 videos and manuals. Home **Improvement Reference Center** is designed to assist homeowners in do-it-yourself projects, as well as educate about general upkeep, home maintenance and remodeling projects. One of the

Indiana State Library's most crucial long-term goals is to ensure that every Hoosier has local public library service. We continue to provide support for Indiana libraries extending their current service area or services such that unserved or underserved populations gain increased access to library services and electronic resources. Yet today, roughly 6.5% of Hoosiers still do not have public library service, no information safety net or alternative point of access to information exists for those unable to afford or access online resources at home.

Anyone whose library is located in a county that has an unserved population is aware of the challenges that front line staff deal with on regular basis. To that end, a trio of library directors that includes Ellen Stuckey (Butler Public Library), Kelly Ehinger (Adams Public Library System) and Jacob Speer (Hussey-Mayfield Memorial Public Library) are hosting a Summit on Serving the Unserved on July 11 from 1:00 PM-4:00 PM (EDT) in Indianapolis. # **Twelve Libraries Awarded Institutional Literacy Grants**

The 2011 LSTA Institutional **Literacy Grants** 

Indiana State Library awarded grants totaling over \$45,000 to twelve state institutions. The institutional literacy grants facilitate improved literacy among the individuals under custody of the state. Institutions strive to meet literacy goals at multiple educational levels and may request funds for library materials that meet their specific literacy needs. Materials that are frequently borrowed through interlibrary loan may also be purchased through the institutional literacy grant program.
