Libraries, Individuals Encouraged to Join in Banned Books Week

Banned Books Week: 9/30-10/6/12

The American Library Association's (ALA) Office for Intellectual Freedom (OIF) is coordinating a "50-State Salute to Banned Books Week" to commemorate the 30th anniversary of Banned Books Week. From September 30 through October 6,2012, OIF will highlight videos from ALA chapters (and other libraries, library-related organizations, and

bookstores, even those outside the US) proclaiming the importance of the freedom to read. The "50 State Salute" will consist of videos (no longer than 5 minutes) that emphasize ways in which each state's community celebrates the freedom to read during Banned Books Week. Video montages demonstrating more elaborate community celebrations are also accepted. The ALA cites this video montage from the Mooresville (Ind.) Public Library as a great example.

The deadline to submit a video is September 28. Only organizations (not individuals) may participate in the 50-state event. All individuals who wish to participate in Banned Books Week are encouraged to create a video for the **Banned Books Virtual Read-Out.**

The Indiana State Historic Records Advisory Board (SHRAB) has two grant opportunities, archival assessment and digitization grants available to not-forprofit organizations and units of local government in the State of Indiana. Individual grants provide up to \$5,000 in funds and require a local match in cash or in-kind services. Applications are due by Friday, September 14, 2012 and may be found at SHRAB.IN.gov.
