As in previous years, state contest winners will receive a cash award, plaque, and book of their letter from the Indiana Center for the Book at an awards ceremony in late spring. First-place winners also advance to the national level competition and are eligible for the \$1,000 grand prize and runner-up cash prizes.

Make plans this Saturday to join dozens of Hoosier authors while earning LEUs at the Indy Authors Fair. The fair is scheduled from 10:00 a.m-4:30 p.m. (EDT) at the Central Library in

downtown Indianapolis. Ten workshops, expert panels, and programs are scheduled throughout the day, all of which offer one to two Library Education Units (LEUs).

Nearly 40 notable Hoosier authors will be present at the Authors Fair, including several previous Indiana Authors Award winners and finalists. John Green, winner of this year's national Indiana Authors Award, will headline the Indiana Authors Award Dinner, which follows the Fair on Saturday.

The Indy Authors Fair is free and open to the public and is presented by the Eugene & Marilyn Glick Fund, the Indianapolis Public Library Foundation; the Indianapolis Public Library and The Writers' Center of Indiana.

The workshop is scheduled for Friday October 5, 2012 from 9:00 AM- 4:00 PM at the Indiana State Library and will cover basics of digitizing photograph collection and best practices for creating and maintaining digital collections.

Presenters Joan Hostetler and John Harris own Heritage Photo & Research Services. They regularly consult about photograph preservation and digital imaging with historical societies, museums, libraries, and archives throughout Indiana. Hostetler studied preservation and archives management at the George Eastman House International Museum of Photography and Film and has owned Heritage Photo since 1998. Harris is a graduate of the Cooperstown Graduate Program of the State University of New York and was Director of Local History Services at the Indiana Historical Society.
