Two Public Libraries Awarded Significant Community Block Grants

Congratulations to the Andrews-Dallas Township Public Library and the Haubstadt Branch of the Fort Community & Rural Branch-Johnson Township Public Library, which have Affairs been named as recipients of 2012 Community Focus

Indiana Office of

Fund (CFF) grants from the Indiana Office of Community and Rural Affairs.

The Andrews-Dallas Township Public Library will receive \$261,102 for infrastructure improvements to the Library originally built in 1926. The project involves the construction of a new accessible main entrance, a street level entrance to the basement meeting room, an additional fire exit and other improvements that would make both levels of the building accessible to everyone in the community.

The Fort Branch-Johnson Township Public Library has been awarded \$400,000 to pay for construction of the new Haubstadt Branch.

These grants were included in the 16th round of CFF grants awarded by Lt. Gov. Becky Skillman since 2005. CFF grants assist Indiana's smaller cities and towns with their long term development initiatives. The grant dollars fund projects such as sewer upgrades, new fire trucks, libraries and community centers. CFF grants are funded by the federal Community Development Block Grant program and administered by the Indiana Office of Community and Rural Affairs.

Ten first place librarians will receive \$5,000 cash each, a plaque and \$500 travel stipend to attend an awards reception in New York. A plaque will also be given to each award winner's library.

State Records Board Offers Grants to **Preserve At-Risk Collections**

The Indiana State Historic Records Advisory Board (SHRAB) has two grant opportunities, archival assessment and digitization grants available to not-for-profit organizations and units of local government in the State of Indiana. Individual grants provide up to \$5,000 in funds and require a local match in cash or in-kind services. Applications are due by Friday, September 14, 2012 and may be found at SHRAB.IN.gov.
