Returning to the State Library is a homecoming for Speer who served as Director of the Library Development Office from 2005-2010. Most recently he acted as Executive Director of the Waukee (IA) Public Library. He was also Executive Director of the Hussey-Mayfield Public Library in Zionsville from 2010-2013.

"Jake has proven himself a leader at both the state and local public library level, which made him an ideal fit as Indiana so next State Librarian, so said Robert Barcus, ILHB President. "Given his familiarity with State Library staff, policies and services, the ILHB is confident in his ability to hit the ground running.

Speer is the 34th State Librarian since the agency was established in 1825.
