Promising young Hoosier writers were honored at the 2014 Indiana Youth Literary Day & Awards Ceremony held at the Indiana State Library. Over 250 guests, including students, teachers and proud family members, attended the ceremony headlined by award-winning, young-adult author Christine Johnson.

Indiana Center for the Book

Youth Literary Day recognizes winners and semifinalists in the national Letters About Literature and River of Words contests. Letters About Literature is a national reading-writing contest that asks students in grades 4-12 to write a personal letter to an author, explaining how his or her work changed their view of the world or themselves. River of Words is designed to help youth express themselves through the arts, while exploring their environment and developing a sense of place and appreciation for discovery. Both contests are programs of the Indiana Center for the Book and Center for the Book in the Library of Congress. Indiana Youth Literary Day is made possible through the generous support of *The James & Madeleine McMullan Family Foundation* and *Poetry Contests for a Cause*, an initiative of Anderson, Indiana poet Stacy Savage.
