



Kanopy service with Plus Packs



The Allen County Public Library has announced a major enhancement to its Kanopy streaming service. The new Kanopy Plus Packs, which offer unlimited access to select content, launched Jan. 1. Plus Packs make it easier for library cardholders to enjoy movies, TV shows and educational programs without the need to use limited monthly tickets.

Kanopy Plus Packs are pre-paid packages of curated content that are available to all adult Allen County Public Library patrons. By funding these packages up front, the library will eliminate the need for patrons to use their limited monthly tickets to

participant was given a goal of raising \$10, equivalent to a little over \$200 today.

Fortunately, for young Indiana participants, the winter of 1917-18 was a particularly bad one for the Midwest. Temperatures reached record lows and snow fell frequently. According to this booklet put out by the Indiana YMCA War Work Council, one boy was able to raise his \$10 in just a week by shoveling snow. Others helped wheel coal, the primary source of fuel for most buildings, to those in need.

Another particularly enterprising young man turned his father's car into an impromptu taxi service and charged people fares to transport them around snow-bound communities. Details are murky on how much money was actually raised in Indiana, but the war would be over by the end of the year. The winter of 1917-18 remains one of the worst in recorded history for the Midwest.
