The U.S. Government Publishing Office (GPO) provides real time access to the U.S. government through their website. The Congressional Record is a daily window into the U.S. Senate and U.S. House and their many committees. The early actions of the nation's government were originally covered by newspapers. then published as The Debates and Proceedings in the Congress of the United States - now known as the Annals of Congress - between 1789 and 1824. From 1824 to 1837, they were published as The Register of Debates, which overlapped with

Researchers can view Federal Register.gov directly. They can also see current legislative activities of the 119th Congress here.
