FCPL announces poetry writing workshop with John Hinton of the Poetry Society of Indiana



The Frankfort Community Public Library has announced a poetry writing workshop featuring president of the Poetry Society of Indiana, John Hinton, on Saturday, May 13, at 11 a.m. The event is in coordination with the creation of FCPL's inaugural literary journal, The Edge, which will feature the work of local teen writers and authors.

Aspiring authors grades 6-12 are invited to attend. Attendees will discuss poetry, build a word bank and learn about writing from a personal point of view. The 90minute program will culminate with students creating a poem of their own. Registration is required This year's meeting will feature an interesting session from students from the University of Michigan School of Information, who will present an assessment of the user experience with GovInfo.gov. The virtual meeting will also commemorate the 50th anniversary of the creation of the Depository Library Council designed to advise GPO on the administration of the FDLP.
