### 'Round our Indiana homesteads...



April's rains have righted March's drought, and many Hoosiers have turned their thoughts to planting. Fields, crops and trees are ingrained in the Hoosier conscience, with many Hoosier poets and composers including Sycamores, corn and hay in their works. But, what of soybeans? Last year, Indiana farmers planted about 5.50 million acres of corn and soybean each. This year the state estimates that 31% of the crops will be corn and 29% soybean.

Sure, soybean doesn't wave quite like corn, or grow knee-high by the Fourth of July, but like corn, the crop feeds livestock and poultry and is integral in the creation of <u>biofuels</u>, used to power the <u>trams</u> at the State Fair. Moreover, it is converted into fiber such as that found in carpet.

The <u>United States Department of</u> <u>Agriculture</u> maintains all sorts of statistics related to crop production and offers detailed statistics by state. Those for Indiana can be found <u>here</u>.

This growing season, take one moment to read up on what Indiana farms are producing, and then take another to appreciate those Indiana homesteads where the soybean waves.

This open textbook, made possible through a <u>Textbook Creation</u> <u>Grant</u> from the <u>PALSave: PALNI</u> <u>Affordable Learning</u> program, is set to enhance the way medical professionals learn and apply ultrasound technology.
