The Plainfield-Guilford Township Public Library is partnering with the Human Library organization, the Hendricks County Alliance for Diversity, Hendricks County Pride and the Hendricks County Community Foundation to host a Human Library event on Saturday, April 8 from 1-3 p.m. Participants can drop in for a 20-minute conversation with a human "book," who will share their story as a person with a disability, as a minority or as a person possessing another unique life experience.

The 2022 Community Needs Assessment from the Hendricks County Community Foundation found that 23.2% of residents noted that diversity, equity and inclusion are areas of concern in the area. The Plainfield-Guilford Township Public Library is helping to address this concern by facilitating deeper conversations in the community. This event is made possible through generous funding from the Hendricks County Community Foundation's Community Unity Grant.

Library staff heard about the Human Library project through other libraries in the state - and across the country - who have held these events with great success in their communities. The Human Library is an international organization whose purpose is to unpack biases in candid conversations with local volunteers. On Jan. 1, 1968, in the town of Dunreith, Indiana at approximately 9:30 p.m., a westbound Pennsylvania Railroad freight train derailed after a section of track broke. Public Library Association seeking proposals and speakers for 2024 conference



The Public Library Association is currently seeking proposals and speakers for its 2024 conference. The conference will be held on April 3-5, 2024, at the Greater Columbus Convention Center in Columbus, Ohio.

PLA offers over 100 top-quality education sessions - curated by public library workers for public library workers - that foster innovation, inclusion and collaboration. Pennsylvania Railroad freight train carrying anhydrous ammonia, acetone cyanohydrin and crude oil.

The resulting fire and explosions destroyed two homes, along with the town's only industry, the Dunreith Cannery. Homes and businesses in a 12-block area of the town were damaged and the 236 residents of Dunreith had to be evacuated from their homes due to the possibility of further explosions.

Chemicals from the wreck leaked into Buck Creek and extended all the way to the east fork of the White River killing numerous livestock and wildlife. Area residents also had to deal with a contaminated water supply.

The train accident at Dunreith, along with other rail accidents in the U.S., spurred Congress to updating and strengthening safety and maintenance regulations for railroads.

The home of Verney and Flossie Crum - pictured above - was one of the two homes destroyed by the aftermath of the train crash. The Crum family were in Florida at the time of the crash, along with Ollie and Minnie Boyd, whose home nearby was severely damaged. The owner of the other home destroyed, Harold Linville and his family, fled before the explosion occurred.
