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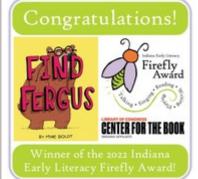

hearts in Indiana. Thank you to the Indiana Early Literacy Firefly Committee for the nomination; to all the parents, teachers and librarians who work to make award and reading and literacy programs like this happen; and especially all the children who voted for 'Find Fergus.' I don't know who has a bigger smile right now, myself or Fergus," Boldt said.

This is the eighth year of the Indiana Early Literacy Firefly Award. Votes were submitted from 60 Indiana counties and over 3,300 Indiana children ages 0-5 voted. Votes were collected at public libraries, schools and daycares, and also via a remote voting form available on the Indiana State Library's website.

The Indiana Early Literacy Firefly Award is an initiative of the Indiana Center for the Book designed to promote early childhood literacy in Indiana. The nominees are chosen by the Indiana Early Literacy Firefly Committee from a list of books nominated by library staff who work with children all over Indiana.

The nominated books are chosen for their ability to encourage parents and children to use the Every Child Ready to Read® practices of talking, singing, reading, writing and playing together. Caregivers can use the Firefly books as a quality go-to resource for having fun and learning with their young children.

Indiana State Library Genealogy & Local History Fair 2022

The Indiana State Library will once again host its popular Genealogy and Local History Fair in downtown Indianapolis on Saturday, Oct. 22. The free event will take place from 10 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. in the library's History Reference Room.

This year's theme is "Family Drama: Researching Your Complicated and Unconventional Ancestors." Presenters will use case studies to illustrate research techniques and contextualize family stories within the larger scope of history. Attendees will also be encouraged to visit the exhibition hall to collect information from genealogy and local history organizations and to shop the commercial vendors.

Daniel Hubbard will present "When a Life Becomes Myth" about an odd and dramatic family tale that showed a life slowly being converted to myth over generations. Hubbard will also present "Where the Murderers Roam," concerning family stories that are far more important than they seem on the surface.

Additional presenters include Erin Moulton, who will present "Death of a Showman," examining what happens when the subject of your genealogical research joins the carnival, moves across the country, reappears six years younger, free to leave comments and suggestions.

Constitution Day poster contest



Constitution Day and Citizenship Day is Sept. 17, the date the U.S. Constitution was signed in 1787.

ConstitutionFacts and Government Information for Children, an ALA GODORT group, are sponsoring the 14th Annual U.S. Constitution Day Poster Contest for students. The contest invites K-12 kids, including homeschoolers, to celebrate Constitution Day by designing a poster showing how they benefited from the freedoms embodied in the U.S. Constitution. Entries must be postmarked by Oct. 1 to be eligible. There are prizes for each grade, and each grade winner will receive a Constitution commemorative coin, with the grand prize winner also receiving a \$100 cash prize. The contest is a great opportunity to encourage students to learn about their rights as U.S. citizens. Participating in the contest can help students apply the principles of the Constitution to current events, and to encourage participation in civic events. It's also a fun way for students to learn about the Constitution and visualize what the Constitution means to them. The contest is yet another example of the wealth of government information resources that is created specifically for children to help them learn about their government and how it works.

'Lots to Like About Our New Rules' certification update webinar scheduled



On Tuesday, Sept. 27 from 10-11 a.m., the Indiana State Library will present "Certification Update: Lots to Like About Our New Rules," a webinar that will cover new certification rules that go into effect on Jan. 1, 2023.

Presenter Cheri Harris will cover who needs to be certified now; what happens to special certification; changes to certification requirements for LC 4, LC 5 and LC 7; and updates and improvements to continuing education requirements. This program is for library administrators who are responsible for staff certification and staff members who want to stay informed. Harris will discuss compliance under the new rules and answer questions.

Harris has been the certification program director and a legal consultant at the Indiana State Library since 2017. Earlier in her career, she worked at the Legislative Services Agency drafting bills, including a complete recodification of Title 34 on Civil Law and Procedure, and staffing legislative committees.

The webinar is eligible for one LEU for Indiana library staff.
