



"Reimagined Journeys" is a multidisciplinary art collaboration organized by Lafayette artist Bekki Canine. A musician, painter and three poets combined talents to create an exhibit and performance focused on the theme of "Journeys." The process began with the song "Dangerous Journey," composed by Carl Koelling.

"Journeys" is a broad theme that each artist interpreted through their own perspective, background and personal experiences. Observers will find these poems, paintings and song not only explore ideas of physical journeys, but also express internal journeys of growth and change, discomfort and regret.

The poets, Kanika Ahuja, JK Anowe and Logan February, each wrote a poem inspired by the theme. Canine, a painter, also used the theme to create three paintings utilizing collaged pieces of the actual sheet music from Koelling's song. Once these first pieces were completed, the poets and painter exchanged work. They then moved beyond their own interpretations and created new paintings and poems inspired by the imagery, ideas and words of the other artists' work.

Musician Sheeza created a new interpretation of Koelling's song, working with acoustic guitar, - <u>"Paper Maps and Rogue TIGERs:</u> <u>Using Government Documents to</u> <u>Digitize 1980 Census Blocks for</u> <u>IPUMS NHGIS</u>" Kate Knowles, Jonathan Schroeder and Jenny McBurney, University of Minnesota; Wednesday, Aug. 23; 3-4 p.m. EDT.
