Is your library making news?



On Wednesday, Sept. 6 at the Avon-Washington Township Public Library, Tim Evans, investigations editor at the Indianapolis Star, will give a presentation titled "Sexual Abuse in Gymnastics - Revisiting an Investigation."

Evans will speak about the Indianapolis Star's groundbreaking exposé on widespread sexual abuse in gymnastics. The multi-year investigation uncovered the largest sex abuse scandal in sports, changed policies and safety protocols from local clubs to the U.S. Olympic teams and prompted criminal charges against former USA Gymnastics doctor, Larry Nassar.

According to IndyStar.com, "[Evans] joined the staff in 1997 and served in a number of roles as a reporter, covering race and diversity issues, social services, gaming, courts and the law, and children's issues. He worked as an investigative reporter from 2010 until being named to lead IndyStar's award-winning investigation's team in 2022. An Illinois native who began his journalism career in 1977, Evans previously served as a reporter, photographer and editor at newspapers in Indiana and North Carolina."

The presentation will take place at 6 p.m. in Meeting Room A. The program is free and open to adults. Seating is limited, so registration is encouraged to secure a spot. Those



Thomas Entrekin Hibben, Jr. was born to Thomas Entriken and Jane Merrill (Ketcham) Hibben on Oct. 22, 1893 in Indianapolis. After serving in World War I, he studied architecture and engineering at Princeton University, the University of Pennsylvania and schools in London and Paris, France. For a time between 1925 and the early 1930s, Hibben worked with Indianapolis architect Robert Frost Daggett to design buildings at Butler University. The son of an engraver and lithographer, the drawing featured here is a great example of his place in a notable artistic family in Indianapolis. His sister Helene Louise herself studied with William Forsyth and would collaborate with her brother Thomas on designing a nursery and primary school on Pleasant Run Parkway, which operated until the 1960s.

Hibben was also involved in the first phase of the Lincoln Boyhood National Memorial; worked on New Deal projects for the federal government; served in the military as 1st lieutenant of Company H, 5th Infantry, 17th Division in the U.S. Army in during World War II; and worked as an economic advisor.



- Technology: reliable internet access and computers are available in all ACPL locations. Patrons may also check out mobile hotspot devices for unlimited access to Wi-Fi for up to seven days in their homes, workplaces or anywhere else. Laptops are also available for checkout.
- Meeting rooms: Quiet study spaces and group meeting rooms available for reservation in advance or on-demand, as availability allows.
- Reference assistance: librarians are available in-person, over the

'Grants for Public Libraries' webinar



On Tuesday, Sept. 12, from 11 a.m. -12 p.m., the Indiana State Library will present "Grants for Public Libraries."

Presented by Angela Fox, LSTA and public library consultant at the Indiana State Library, this free webinar aims to give attendees tools to make the grant application process a bit more navigable. Fox will discuss the places to search, as well as provide tips for putting the best foot forward, when it comes time to submit a grant proposal.

"While every library is unique, they all seem to share one thing in common: they could use more money! Grants might be the just thing to help buy technology for STEM programming or get a new service initiative off the ground. But applying for grants can be overwhelming – and that's assuming you can even find one for which you qualify," writes Fox.

Those who cannot attend the live webinar may request to have the recording sent to them when it is ready - usually within 30 days of the live session - via this form. The



phone or online to answer research questions and assist in accessing library services and resources.

- Research databases: thousands of articles are available online to assist in writing term papers and research projects.
