ILHB adopts new regulatory requirements for Public Libraries

The Indiana State Library and Historic Board held a public hearing on Friday, December 4, to consider comments and deliberate on the proposed revisions to Indiana's public library standards. The hearing was the final culmination of the efforts of the standards committee members who gave so generously of their time to meet and determine appropriate modifications to the existing public library standards.

The public hearing concluded with a motion and unanimous vote approving the revised standards. If the proposed rule is approved by the Indiana Attorney General and Governor's office, the revised standards will take effect January 1, 2017.

The Indiana State Library Foundation in collaboration with the Indiana State Library's Talking Books & Braille Library is seeking applicants for a new grant supporting patrons with the purchase of assistive technology devices. The grants will provide monetary reimbursements in an amount ranging from \$50 to \$1,000 towards the purchase of an assistive technology device of the grant recipient's choosing. These devices remove many barriers to education and employment for visually impaired individuals and may include: video magnifiers, optical character recognition systems, speech systems, etc.
