PLAC fee to remain unchanged in 2024

2024 PLAC FEE \$65



The Indiana Library and Historical Board voted unanimously on Dec. 14 to keep the cost of the Public Library Access Card at \$65 effective Jan. 1, 2024.

The PLAC program allows library patrons to purchase a card which permits them to borrow materials directly from any public library in Indiana.

Any individual who holds a valid Indiana public library card may obtain a card. The cost of the card is \$65 and each card is valid for 12 months after being issued.

The Indiana State Library collects the revenue from the sale of these cards and places it in a designated fund account for the PLAC o.m.

The Peggy Barber Tribute Grant is an annual grant that recognizes, promotes and supports meaningful programs in libraries that have limited or no access to budgetary support for programming. This grant aims to help ease budget challenges by annually awarding three libraries \$2,500 to support a proposed program, program series or programming effort.
