

Dashboard. It allows data users to access data and create reports based on current housing needs by county.
Across the top of the website, one can choose to view the current demographic, housing stock, affordability measures and jobs in their county. Compare these housing topics for up to three counties at a time.

Users can also create a report based on the housing measures in their county. The new dashboard lets one select counties from a dropdown menu or click to select a county in an online map. Each report automatically lists the data sources used in creating its graphics.

CSLP state representatives will solicit feedback and suggestions for slogans and themes via survey. The representative will then narrow down the suggestions to the most popular ones and submit those to the CSLP Theme and Slogan Committee. The committee then goes through the suggestions from all the state reps. They submit the popular suggestions to lawyers to be vetted in order to make sure they aren't copyrighted and that there are no other unforeseen issues. They also submit them to Spanish speakers who make suggestions for what will and won't translate well. The committee then holds a listening session where public library staff from across the country have an opportunity to weigh in on the final 20 or so suggestions. Finally, the CSLP state reps vote on the final slogan and theme at their Annual Meeting in the fall.
