In its eighth year, the literacy award recognizes picture books that serve an important role in the first years of a child's life and encourages parents, caregivers and very young children to interact together with exceptional picture books.

Wednesday Word | February 2, 2022

Voting is limited to children who live in Indiana and who are under age 6 as of July 31. It is expected that most Indiana children will require help from a parent, caregiver or librarian. Children should circle their favorite Firefly nominee on their ballot and turn it in to their local voting location. This year, every public library system in Indiana will receive 15 print copies of the ballot and six sheets of Firefly stickers for marking nominees and winning titles. Packets of printed materials should arrive by late February or early March. Tallies will be accepted through July 31 and the award winner will be announced on Aug. 8. Voting locations should tally the votes and send them in an email to the Indiana Center for the Book.

The Indiana Center for the Book will be releasing a program guide by March 15. The award nomination period runs through the summer, allowing librarians to do Firefly programs to coincide their summer reading programs.

### What's Up Wednesday 'kind communication' webinar scheduled for Feb. 23



As part of the Indiana State Library's What's up Wednesday series, "Build a Better World at Work and in Life with Kindness and Gratitude" will be presented on Wednesday, Feb. 23, from 10-11 a.m.

Science has shown that people who practice gratitude in their lives show an increase in enthusiasm toward life, make more progress toward their personal goals, sleep better, show less symptoms of illness and depression and have more energy.

In this webinar, presenter David Seckman will discuss how cultivating kindness and gratitude can improve work and personal relationships, as well overall wellbeing. Learn how practicing "kind communication" can help determine the success of employee interactions with co-workers and customers alike. Discover the most important ingredient to improving team dynamics, according to a large research project sponsored by Google.

It's income tax filing season! The Indiana Department of Revenue has Indiana individual income tax forms available online. Check out DOR's FAQs for 2021 Tax Year (Filed in 2022). Indiana residents who contribute to CollegeChoice 529 Savings Plans, may find this tax credit information from the Indiana State Treasurer useful. Some property tax deductions might be reported on Indiana income tax returns and the Indiana Department of Local Government Finance has deduction forms online for Hoosier taxpayers wishing to claim property tax deductions. Please note the qualifications, filing deadlines, and the county offices to send the forms for approval. Tax matters can be complicated, and the Indiana DOR's legal resources explains how to request written guidance from their Tax Policy Division and how to file an appeal.

#### Be aware of <u>scams targeting</u> <u>taxpayers</u>, since the

IRS doesn't initiate contact with taxpayers by email, text messages or social media channels to request personal or financial information. If there is a problem, the IRS will mail a notice or letter, as explained on the webpage <u>Understanding your IRS</u> <u>notice or letter</u>. Similarly, the Indiana DOR <u>warns of scams</u> impersonating the IRS or DOR. The Indiana Attorney General also warns of property tax exemption offers among the <u>scams targeting seniors</u>.

For federal income tax filing, the Internal Revenue Service has <u>forms</u>, <u>publications</u>, <u>and instructions</u> available online. The IRS has information for filers concerning <u>child tax credit payments</u> and how to

claim a missing economic impact payment. All taxpayers are being encouraged to file online using federal filing options and Indiana filing options due to anticipated delays in processing paper returns. Check the IRS website for information about free tax return preparation for qualifying taxpayers and where to find VITA/TCE and AAPR Tax-Aide sites. To support volunteer tax preparers, Indiana DOR has created a Volunteer Handbook, which contains legislative updates, due dates, changes to common forms and other information. The federal and state filing deadlines to submit 2021 tax returns or an extension to file and pay tax owed is Monday, April 18, 2022.
