# Is your library making news?

The committee is particularly interested in research around serving diverse patrons.

Criteria for selection includes originality, quality and impact. In respective order, this entails potential for research to fill a gap in reference knowledge or to build on previous studies; research design and methodologies; and significance of the study for improving the quality of reference service. Research projects may be in-progress or completed. Previously published research or research accepted for publication will not be accepted.

Two-page proposals, in the form of a Word document, are due by Monday, Jan. 31. Notification of acceptance will be made by Monday, Feb. 28.

Page one, the contact information page, should include the primary contact's name, title, institutional affiliation, mailing address and email address. Additional research team members should also be noted in the appropriate field. Page two, the research description page, should include the title of the project; explicit statement of the research problem; description of the research design and methodologies; findings or results if available; and a brief discussion of the originality, unique contribution, potential impact and significance of the research.

Research descriptions that exceed the 250 word limit will be automatically rejected. The research description must not include any personally identifiable information. For examples of projects presented at past forums, please see the Committee's website.

INDIGO is an association whose members are library professionals interested in government information. The organization contributes to the extension and improvement of education and training of government information librarians. The exhibit explores the endless motion of the water cycle, water's effect on landscape, settlement and migration and its impact on culture and spirituality. It looks at how political and economic planning have long been affected by access to water and control of water resources, and how human creativity and resourcefulness provide new ways of protecting water resources and renewing respect for the natural environment. Designed for smalltown museums, libraries and cultural organizations, "Water/Ways" serves as a community meeting place to hold conversations about water's impact on American culture.

"We are thrilled to host the 'Water/Ways' exhibit! Months of preparation and hard work by library staff, particularly programming coordinator Ann Inman, have made opening day possible," said library director Judi Terpening. "We hope that every visitor will enjoy the experience."

The exhibit will be open every day, including Sundays, until Feb. 20. The library is located at 420 W. Main St. in Madison.
