

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#### Rockin' in Little Rock (ARSL)



The Association for Rural & Small Libraries (ARSL) invites proposals for break-out session presentations for the 2015 Conference to be held in Little Rock, Arkansas, October 1st through 3rd.

deadline to submit the form is March 13, 2015. All proposals will be reviewed by the Conference Programming Committee. Those who submit a proposal will be notified whether or not their proposal was accepted by April 6, 2015.

This year's conference theme is "Rockin' in Little Rock." Themes we hope to see among your proposals include the following:

#### LSTA Children's Literacy Grants

In the past, the Indiana State Library has offered grants, subsidies, and statewide trainings through our Children's Literacy project. This year, we're letting YOU decide what you need to improve service to children within your library!

The goal of the new <u>2014-2015 LSTA Children's Literacy</u> <u>grants</u> is to make funding available for public libraries statewide to enhance their physical spaces for Indiana's youngest library users (defined as ages 0-17 years). Through these grants, libraries may apply for up to \$5,000 for improvements to their children's and/or YA departments. Grant funds may be used for furnishings (including seating, displays, and shelving), manipulatives, rugs- just about anything it would take to make your library a more welcoming space for children and their caregivers. Projects improving the ability to serve special populations may be given preference.

Examples of items that may be purchased with grant funds include:

- Browseable book bins for preschoolers
- Seating for story time or study areas
- ADA-compliant computer workstations, tables, or seating
- Message boards for community and caregiver information
- Improved signage and way-finding
  - Free-standing activity centers
  - STEM/educational toys and games

# ALA Partners with CLA to offer MOOC

The American Library Association is proud to announce its partnership with the Canadian Library Association (CLA) and the University of Toronto iSchool in offering its popular MOOC (Massively Open Online Course), entitled "Library Advocacy Unshushed: Values, Evidence, Action" beginning February 1, 2015.

Offered through the EdX consortium, in which the University of Toronto collaborates with other leading universities, "Library Advocacy Unshushed" is now available for registration via this URL:

The course starts February 2, 2015, and ends March 23, 2015. There is no prerequisite, though basic knowledge of librarianship is recommended. Through this open form of course delivery, including videos, online discussions, quizzes, and video interviews with guest experts, participants will learn how to be powerful advocates for the values and future of libraries and librarianship. Participants should expect to commit four to five hours of study per week.

These grants are on an expedited time-line and recipients will need to act quickly to complete their contracts and purchasing. LSTA grants are reimbursement grants, and there is a required 10% local cash match (up to \$500). Please note- these grants may not be used to pay for staffing, technology, or collection development- the focus is on improving the physical space.

#### **Basic Book Repair Workshop**




Kary Barth, regional sales manager for Kapco Library Products, has a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Illinois, Urbana and has worked with libraries since 1990.

This workshop is designed to demonstrate quick and easy techniques for extending shelf life on general circulating materials. Prevention is the key, but we will be addressing specific, common repairs: re-inserting loose pages, broken spines, torn header caps, ripped and torn pages.

Each participant is asked to bring: one or two paperback books, preferably new or new-like, to demonstrate covering techniques: a hardbound book with a book jacket to demonstrate application of book jacket covers; a stapled book or magazine; one hardbound book that needs repair and a "naked" hardbound book; i.e., a hardbound book that does NOT have a book jacket cover.
