Gaming safety for all ages



Online games and apps on mobile devices can be fun to play, but everyone should take steps to protect devices and personal information from falling into the wrong hands. The Indiana Cybersecurity Hub has posted safety tips to read after data breaches of popular gaming sites were brought to light. Read the whole article "Rolling The Dice For Your Cybersecurity" on their blog.

Before downloading any new gaming app, make sure it's legitimate by checking out the reviews and looking it up online first. Think before clicking. Cybercriminals will often try to entice gamers into clicking links or downloading malicious files by offering cheat codes, hacks or other ways to gain an advantage over competitors. If the offer seems too good to be true, chances are it is. Limit access to personal identity information and data. Use caution and avoid using geo-tagging by turning off location data. Choose a safe game username that doesn't include real first or last names if
