South Bend News-Times, HSC has just digitized runs of smaller historic journals dating back to 1812. With an eye toward expanding our reach into the mid-20th century, papers now include the historic African-American Evansville Argus from 1938 to 1943 and the Greencastle Daily Banner and Banner Times, spanning the years 1916 to 1974.

Other titles will appeal to researchers digging into the early history of Bloomington, Connersville, Corydon, Lawrenceburg, Logansport, Richmond, Rockville, Salem, and Shelbyville. Among HSC's latest batch of newspapers are some of the oldest in the Midwest, including over 1000 issues of the Vincennes Western Sun; Madison's Western Clarion; and smaller titles from Brookville, New Albany, and Charlestown dating back to early statehood days.
