Hayes has been a member of BCALA since 2010, most recently serving as vice president. She says the organization has positively impacted her career.

"I've been personally impacted by learning from members informally and at conferences, as well as by being mentored by Marcia Smith Woodard and having access to leadership opportunities," Hayes said. "As president, I want to continue the legacy of librarians like Effie Lee Morris, one of the BCALA founders, and Shauntee Burns-Simpson, our immediate past president. We are a 52-year young organization that strives to promote librarianship and advocate for the full inclusion of Black librarians within the profession. I want to grow our membership and increase our ability to connect members in a meaningful way."

# Floyd D. Hopper, the 'dean of Indiana watercolorists'



Floyd D. Hopper, referred to as the "dean of Indiana watercolorists," worked in both watercolor and oil paintings and was best known for his early works in the regionalist style. born in 1909, he lived most of his life in Indianapolis and Noblesville, where he worked at different times as a lithographer and teacher.

This United Fruit Company stationary with a drawing of a pirate ship was created by him as a student at John Herron Art Institute, where he attended during 1929-33 and studied under several notable Hoosier Group artists including William Forsyth. It was chosen here for the playfulness of a student not seen in his later work. Hopper married Hazel Glenne Whitefeather, who worked at the Indiana State Library for 44 years from 1931 to 1975, in 1936 and this connection is how the Hopper drawings came to be donated to the library. The collection includes his early works from his first time at the John
