## Carnegie-Whitney Grant available from ALA



Submissions for the Carnegie-Whitney Grant are now being accepted. The Carnegie-Whitney Grant provides an award that is based on a special fund first established by Andrew Carnegie in 1902. The fund was subsequently enhanced by a merger with a fund established by James Lyman Whitney in 1910. The Publishing Committee, a standing committee of the American Library Association, administers the grant.

The Carnegie-Whitney Grant provides grants for the preparation of popular or scholarly reading lists, webliographies, indexes and other guides to library resources that will



Richard Lieber, born in 1869, has been called the "father" of the Indiana State Park system. Lieber saw the value of preserving land for recreation and relaxation, as well as for the conservation of land and wildlife. He believed that setting aside parcels of land as nature preserves would enable both a person alive today, and their greatgreat grandchild years in the future, to have the same outdoor experience. These nature preserves would be a constant and a solace for young and old alike.

Part of the land dedicated as Richard Lieber State Park was formerly known as the Cagles Mill Development. Lieber State Park lies in Putnam and Owen Counties, about halfway between Indianapolis and Terre Haute. Cagles Mill Lake is a manufactured reservoir and is part of a system of flood-control and water usage reservoir projects in the Ohio Valley. It was the first such reservoir to be built in Indiana. In addition, the park is home to Cataract Falls, a natural waterfall. The land became an Indiana State Park in 1952 and was dedicated to Richard Lieber in the ceremony for which this program was printed, held on July 12, 1958.

The grants - up to \$5,000 awarded annually - are intended to cover preparation costs appropriate to the development of a useful product, including the cost of research. The grants do not cover the costs of final printing or online distribution of the product. Grants are awarded to individuals; local, regional or state libraries; associations or organizations, including units, affiliates and committees of the American Library Association; or programs of information and library studies or library science.

The projects must be focused on American libraries; must demonstrate how the project would stimulate the use of library resources; must have the potential appeal and usefulness to a broad audience; must be intended for national distribution; must meet a need for publication; must be completed within two years; and must be new or in process.

Deadline for submission of the proposal is Nov. 4. The number and the amount of the grants are at the discretion of the Publishing Committee and vary from year to year.
