is geared to those who have taken a DNA test and are asking themselves, "Now what? What does this all mean? How can I use my DNA results to answer my genealogy questions?"

Many people find the ethnicity estimates provided as part of their DNA test results to be confusing, surprising or just plain bad. The presentation will go behind the scenes to explain the science behind ethnicity estimates and genetic communities. Learn about the benefits and limitations of ethnicity estimates, along with techniques to use ethnicity estimates as a tool in genealogy research. The workshop will be presented by Steven Frank.

Angela Guntz will also explore the Thrulines tool available at AncestryDNA. Thrulines helps visualize common ancestor link to your DNA match.

Andrea Ackermann will wrap up the day focusing on shared matches. The shared match list is the go-to DNA tool. Shared matches are the common matches between two DNA relatives. All major companies offer a shared match.

On Saturday, Aug. 12, at 11 a.m., the Indiana State Library will host a land use workshop. Platting an ancestor's land can help answer questions and add much-needed context to a family's story. The presentation will help attendees understand the differences and similarities of the Metes and Bounds Survey and the Public Land Survey Systems. This interactive workshop with genealogist John Barr will help attendees learn how to read land descriptions and teach how to draw a plat of an ancestor's property and place it on any map.

A limited number of rulers and protractors will be available at the workshop for use to practice platting land descriptions. Attendees are encouraged to bring their own land records if they need help deciphering them.

In a [May 15 press release](#) from the Indiana State Department of Agriculture, the [Indiana Conservation Partnership](#) announced its 2022 conservation accomplishments. The ICP works with Hoosier landowners to provide technical or financial assistance for the implementation of conservation projects.

The [Indiana Conservation Partnership report](#) showed that over the last year landowners helped prevent over 1.8 million tons of sediment, over 3.9 million pounds of nitrogen and over 1.9 million pounds of phosphorus from entering

Lois Lenski Covey Foundation bookmobile grant program now accepting applications



The Lois Lenski Covey Foundation is now accepting applications for its bookmobile grant program. The grants range from \$500 to \$3,000 and are specifically for book purchases, meaning they can't be used for administrative or operational uses.

The LLCF no longer provides grants to schools, public libraries or other libraries for the purchase of children's books, with the exception of bookmobiles.

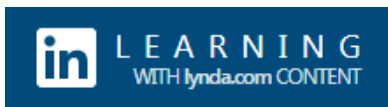
The bookmobile grant program provides grants for purchasing children's fiction or nonfiction books. The books are to be available for checkout by young people for pleasure reading or, perhaps, as a source of information for a school assignment. The library grant program does not provide funds for book distribution programs, atlases, dictionaries, basal readers or similar texts, workbooks or similar instructional tools, magazine

The LLCF bookmobile grant program provides grants for the purchase of books for children preschool through grade eight. Only organizations within the United States, its territories or commonwealths are eligible.

Grant awardees will be asked to return a brief questionnaire and to provide documentation of grant spending.

The last grant within a given year will be awarded by Oct. 30. To be considered by that date, applications must be postmarked by Sept 1. Applications postmarked after Sept. 1 will be evaluated early the following year during the next cycle.
