In honor of the town of Otterbein's sesquicentennial - or 150th anniversary - The Otterbein 150 Project has worked since the beginning of 2022 to create an exhibit celebrating the town's rich history. This exhibit is nearing completion and will be on display starting Aug. 4 at the Otterbein Public Library, in Otterbein, just 13 miles west of West Lafayette.

The town of Otterbein was founded in 1872 and named for land donor William Otterbein Brown, who was also a school teacher, stock dealer and the town's first postmaster until his death in 1879. The town is currently home to a bit over 900 people, and a lot of history.
