Hoosier Rosie the Riveter



World War II saw a vast expansion in work opportunities for American women. As men were pulled from factory floors for military duty, women eagerly replaced them. The ubiquitous image of a woman clad in work coveralls, covered hair and wielding industrial machinery -most famously depicted in the Rosie the Riveter poster campaign -was frequently reproduced by companies throughout the war.

This example is from the Indianapolis plant of the U.S. Rubber Company. Like many companies, U.S. Rubber pivoted its manufacturing focus on defense products during the second world war. The company made rubber tires for military vehicles during World War II.

A new survey from the University of Oklahoma focusing on refugees is now available. Funded by the Institute for Museum and Library Services and conducted by June Abbas of the School of Library and Information Studies, Chie Noyori-Corbett of the Zarrow School of Social Work and Jiening Ruan of the Jeannine Rainbolt College of Education, the survey seeks to investigate the status and conditions of refugee services in public libraries across the United States.

Given the important role public libraries play in the lives of the extremely vulnerable refugee population, there is a strong need for better understanding of libraries' roles and practices in meeting the needs of the community. Because refugees may have gone through extremely traumatic experiences, it is also critical to investigate if and how public libraries serving refugee communities adopt and implement trauma-informed and culturally-sensitive practices and programs to meet their needs.

The survey will take approximately 15-20 minutes to complete. The researchers plan to present the results of the survey at a future ALA conference and to share their findings widely on social media and on their project website.
