Johnson County Public Library dedicates sculpture celebrating **Johnson County women**

A new sculpture celebrating the women of Johnson County was unveiled at a ceremony at the Clark Pleasant Branch of the Johnson County Public Library on Sunday, May 21.

The public art installation, made possible by generous donations from community members and a grant from the <u>Johnson County</u> Community Foundation, is titled "The Light Shines Through." Created by artist Kimberly McNeelan - who grew up in Whiteland - the statue is made of bronze, western red cedar, stainless steel, concrete, steel, plywood and paint and depicts a woman walking on a large book, while holding another book in her hand.

In an interview with the Daily Journal, McNeelan said, "The idea of the sculpture is to honor women, of

Abraham Lincoln mural installation photographs



In the Indiana Government Center North building in downtown Indianapolis, state employees pass a sizable, dynamic mural every day on their way to the cafeteria. Titled "Here I Grew Up," the public art piece, designed by Indianapolis native Garo Z. Antreasian, depicts five stages of Abraham Lincoln's life in Indiana between the ages of 7 and 21.

course, specifically to honor women who encouraged literacy in Johnson County. With the sculpture itself, I didn't want to honor just one specific woman. We felt there are a lot of people that deserved to be honored, so I'm honoring six different women, as well as a general everyday woman."

Those women include McNeelan's grandmother; 4-H leaders Missy Suttles and Lois Fitzpatrick; photo journalist Katie Basbagill; Paige Banos, who serves on the Johnson County Library Board; and Erin Davis, who created the Love More-Youth Empowerment Fund.

The plaque inscription reads: "'The Light Shines Through' honors ALL women who have encouraged literacy in Johnson County and beyond. She does not represent just one woman with her casual and classic style. She embodies timeless characteristics with which everyday women can identify. The sculpture's details tell the stories of several specific extraordinary women from Johnson County. The female is emerging from a book recognizing women's stories of the past, present and those yet to come."

piecing the mural together. Over 300,000 hand-cut glass tesserae tiles comprise the mosaic, which spans 70 feet by 25 feet of the travertine marble wall. In the 1980s, the building was renovated and renamed Indiana Government Center North, while a new South Building was constructed across what is now Robert D. Orr Plaza.

one of 240 libraries to participate in
Libraries Transforming
Communities: Accessible Small and

and accessibility resources to small
and rural libraries to help them
better serve people with disabilities.

The competitive award comes with a \$10,000 grant that will help the library with accessibility for all for the Walkerton Unity Garden.

Free training for librarians and library employees on LinkedIn Learning

The Public Library Association, in collaboration with AT&T, has developed eight new DigitalLearn training materials to teach indemand basic computer skills. AT&T is supporting incentive opportunities to enable libraries to successfully share these new DigitalLearn resources with their communities. PLA developed DigitalLearn to offer free tutorials and workshop materials for libraries to teach basic digital skills.

This is the second expanded incentive opportunity for public libraries in 2023, which will again focus on the eight core basic skilling subjects.
All public libraries in the United States and Washington, D.C. are eligible to apply to receive a \$6,000 Digital Literacy Workshop Incentive.

The funded award must be used to conduct workshops to reach a minimum of 36 learners or attendees using one or more of the following DigitalLearn training materials: Internet Basics, Video Conferencing Basics, Cybersecurity Basics, Email Basics, Computer Basics (Windows 10), Computer Basics (macOS 11), Mobile Device Basics (Android or Mobile Device Basics (iOS). Additionally, funds can be used for such things as hiring trainers, printing out materials, purchasing project supplies, renting training space and more.

As part of the grant, Walkerton-Lincoln Township Public Library staff will take an online course in how to lead conversations, a skill vital to library work today. Staff will then host a conversation with residents about what needs to be done to provide accessibility to the Unity Garden and the Walkerton-Lincoln Township Public Library and use the grant funds to further that accessibility.

The initial thought for this grant is to provide a leveling out of the ground and sidewalks around all of the Unity Garden beds. This will allow the free healthy foods that are being grown in the garden and shared with the entire community to be accessible to everyone.
