

Allen County Public Library to host doctor and author William Cooke this weekend



It's harvest time in Indiana, and local fields are full of massive combines. Most modern combines are manufactured in other states by a relatively small number of companies, but in the 19th and early 20th century, Indiana was home to several businesses dedicated to developing and manufacturing agricultural machinery.

Advance Rumely was one of those businesses. Operating out of LaPorte, the company was founded in 1853 by two German immigrant Wednesday Word | November 1, 2023

The Allen County Public Library will host author and doctor William Cooke at the Main Library on Saturday, Nov. 4 at 2 p.m. Dr. Cooke will speak about his book "Canary in the Coal Mine: A Forgotten Community, a Hidden Epidemic, and a Lone Doctor Battling for the Life, Health, and Soul of the People," published in 2021 by Tyndale House Publishers.

In 2004, Dr. Cooke set up his medical practice in rural Austin, Indiana. At the time, he had no brothers. While known mainly for its threshers, the company introduced <u>tractor-pulled combines</u> in the 1920s. It also produced many elaborately illustrated catalogs to showcase its products, several of which have been digitized by the Indiana State Library as part of its <u>Trade Catalogs collection</u>.

This free webinar will provide attendees with an overview of various state and federal laws that address privacy in the library and considerations for crafting related library policies. The library is a public place where individuals go to seek information and resources for reasons and purposes that they may want to keep private, therefore privacy issues arise often in the public library.

In this webinar, some common questions about privacy will be answered, including: "What patron or employment records must be disclosed and to whom?," "Can a citizen take video of staff and other patrons - and the materials they are accessing - in the library without their consent?" and "Can a staff member post cute photos of children participating in library
