Census Bureau website redesigned



A key source for gathering information about the surveys that the U.S. Census Bureau conducts and the data it produces, www.Census.gov, has been redesigned for better user interaction.

The new navigation design focuses on the bureau's audience, including partners, researchers, educators and survey respondents. It also focuses on data product and type of information, such as maps, surveys and programs. Those who haven't visited in a while can click here to explore the new website.

The Indiana State Library often receives questions about the Census Bureau contacting someone by phone or mail about being a participant in a survey. They ask whether the contact they received is legitimate or not. At the top, under the link to survey respondents, or within one quick scroll down the main page, users can find the Census.gov section entitled "Need help with a survey?" with a link to get survey help. This lands at a webpage focusing on help for survey participants, including explanations on how the Census Bureau conducts its surveys and protects participant information. There is also a full webpage enabling users to verify a Census Bureau survey, mailing or contact.
