

With the help of a group of middle schoolers, Montague began the process of collecting basic winter needs for men, women and children who were being served by local shelters. Montague and the children were quickly joined by local schools, churches and businesses.

The following year, Socktober began to spread beyond Montague's local community. Montague, also the creator of the web series Kid President, expanded Socktober even more when, in 2013, a Kid President video promoting the effort was uploaded to YouTube.

Ten years later, the Milford Public Library is one of many organizations joining the Socktober movement. Patrons are encouraged to bring a new pair of socks to the library for any age and size. The library will distribute the donations to the Milford Food Bank, the Milford Food Pantry and Milford School. A collection box is located upstairs in the library. A second box is located in the children's department and is decorated with socks.

## Is your library making news?

Still, popular group activities held at libraries can be an issue for autistic children who can easily become overwhelmed by the noise and activity of peers. Librarians and staff can become overwhelmed as well, when responses to sensory or social inaccessibility lead to what some people call "behaviors."

The presentation will highlight brain differences in autism and show how the differences create unique sensory profiles which, in turn, determine responses to the environment. Attendees will learn about the sensory and social needs of autistic people and how to create an environment that promotes calmness and security, as well as how to prevent or respond to meltdowns. The presentation also includes book recommendations for all ages.

The webinar will be presented by Bev Harp, project director for Innovative Supports for Autistic Workers, a project of the Human Development Institute. Harp is also a self-advocate faculty for LEND at the University of Kentucky. Harp has presented at national conferences for APSE, AHEAD, TASH and many other organizations. She holds a master's degree in social work from the University of Kentucky.
