The course contains an overview of youth services that addresses topics important to all young patrons, followed by age-specific sections on early childhood, school-age children, tweens and teens.

TROIS and Rainbow Reader



The Northeast Indiana Diversity Library was a library, archive and resource center located in Fort Wayne from the late 1970s until 2020. Its mission was "to serve the gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender community and its allies in the Fort Wayne and surrounding area by acquiring, preserving and providing access to materials that embody the culture and history of gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender persons, with a focus on items of local and regional interest whenever possible..." The Indiana State Library acquired the library's collection in 2021, which included the digitized versions of

The <u>first issue</u> of TROIS - or Three Rivers One In Six - appeared in January of 1980 and it ran monthly until 1987. It highlighted topics relevant to the gay community, such as equality and violence, Pride celebrations and other events, letters to the editor and information on the organization. It was not followed by The Rainbow Reader until 1997. The Rainbow Reader provided a similar publication for a new era, including much of the same topics, plus more stories from the community. It ceased in 2008.

Issues of TROIS and the Rainbow Reader can be viewed in the Indiana State Library's <u>Digital Collections</u>.

InfoExpress bag reminder from the State Library



The Indiana State Library would like to remind InfoExpress users to return any InfoExpress bags that are not currently being used. Extra bags can be put into an InfoExpress bag and sent back to the State Library. Users can create a parcel label for them and ship them to the library or they can simply tape a note in the window of the bag that says "EXTRA BAGS" and NOW Courier will return them to the library.

Users who have bags that are torn; bags with zippers that won't stay closed; or bags with windows that are shredded or hanging by a thread have permission to dispose of those bags. While the State Library can repair minor damage as time permits, they do not have the means to repair other types of damage to bags.
