

Anderson is a critically-acclaimed middle-grade novelist, lifelong Hoosier and Indianapolis native. His books for young people include "One Last Shot," "Finding Orion," "Posted," "Sidekicked," "Ms. Bixby's Last Day" and "Granted," a 2019-20 Young Hoosier Book Award finalist. A graduate of Indiana University, he currently spends his free time hiking and biking through Fort Harrison park with his family, searching for the most delicious root beer in the universe, jamming on his piano and encouraging kids to read.

The Indiana Humanities' Speaker Program sends former and current Indiana Authors Award winners and finalists to organizations across Indiana for readings and discussions with local audiences. Anderson was awarded the 2017 Genre Excellence Winner: Middle Grade Fiction Award.

<u>John Green urges communities to</u> <u>stand against censorship in libraries</u>, toward seasoned and beginning researchers looking to make new discoveries about their families' stories. All programming is free and open to the public.

"Family History Month is the perfect opportunity to start the journey, or to get back to it if it's been a while," says Curt Witcher, ACPL's Genealogy Center manager and director of Special Collections. "This research doesn't have to be difficult; sometimes you just need some extra help along the way. That's where a place like the Genealogy Center can come in and help you break through those brickwalls and make new discoveries."

The Genealogy Center is a world-renowned facility with 42,000 square feet of research space housing a little more than 1.2 million items in its physical collection and more than 6.2 million items in its free digital collections, making it the largest public library genealogy research center in the United States. Each year, the Genealogy Center is cited as one of the key tourism features of the region drawing guests from around the globe.

PALNI welcomes Holt as new operations manager



The Private Academic Library Network of Indiana has announced the appointment of Patti Holt as was organized in Chicago in 1883. The two groups merged in 1889.

In 1920, the group renamed as the American Association of University Women, as they are named today. Through the name changed, the mission remained the same, to unite female college alumni in a common purpose. The University Women were setting standards for what college-educated women could and should do to enrich their communities and themselves, such as advocating for women to be admitted to graduate programs and hosting educational lectures for local women and children at libraries and schools.

The Indiana chapter was formed in 1889 under the leadership of May Wright Sewell. Over time, Indiana established local groups meeting in the communities where they lived. The Indiana Federation was established in 1921 to unite the branches. By 1950, there were over 40 local branches active in Indiana.

So, here we are with this official bulletin, began in 1925, over 30 years after first organizing. The Indiana Federation celebrates themselves with this official publication. There were club branches in many Indiana cities and this publication's goal was to inform on activities and promote work being done across the state by the University Women. It's a wonderful record of the activities and concerns of the time. A close read of the **Programs and Branch News** features are interesting. This publication also serves to document the leadership of the various branches.
