Pierce Tone Aging Company



This <u>ornate trade catalog</u> in the Indiana State Library Digital Collection is from the Pierce Tone Aging Company. The name of the company does not adequately describe the interesting nature of the product and the entrepreneur, Burt Pierce.

Pierce was an engraver by trade and a virtuoso violinist who was concertmaster of the Indianapolis Symphony at one time. He patented a secret method to "age" violins, violas and other stringed instruments. This method was designed to speed up the aging process from years into weeks or months.

Pierce's theory was that years of playing a stringed instrument for hours a day were what caused a violin to sound its best. The pamphlet states that the Pierce Tone Aging process involved subjecting the instrument to high-frequency vibrations and pressure that simulated years of use.

Instead of buying an instrument that was hundreds of years old for

the sound of it, such as one made by Stradivari or Guarneri, one could instead buy a newly minted Pierce violin that would sound equally good but at a much more affordable price. In addition, they could send their current or damaged instrument to Pierce, who would apply his aging process to improve the sound quality.

Pierce only made about 200 violins before a fire damaged his factory. He soon became interested in car engines and joined the automotive industry, which was booming around the turn of the 20th century.

Pierce died in 1956 after having a long career in the auto industry.


Blog Spotlight for October: Indiana History Blog from the Indiana Historical Bureau

Clark writes, "In its 90-plus years, Hook's Drugs went from one building in Fountain Square to one of the largest drug store chains in the United States, with over 380 locations and millions in sales. While the company faltered on labor
