

# has been extended to October 13, 2014



Monday, October 13, 2014 is the new deadline for libraries to apply for grants ranging from \$5,000 to \$15,000 to support programs aimed at enhancing adult literacy through The American Dream Starts @ your library® initiative.

To be eligible for funding, the applicant institution must be a public library or a public library with a bookmobile providing literacy services for adult English language learners, and must be within 20 miles of a Dollar General store, distribution center or corporate office. Each funded library will receive a one-time grant of \$5,000 to \$15,000. Libraries from previous rounds of the project are eligible to apply for an additional year of funding with a limit of two consecutive years of funding. Once a library receives two consecutive years of funding, the library may apply again after a one-year hiatus.

Applications for funding are being accepted online through October 13, 2014. Selected applicants will be notified in early November 2014. To learn more about the American Dream Starts @ your library® and/or apply, please visit www.ala.org/americandream
