Biographical Note

Ransom T. Young, born 1843, served throughout the Civil War, first as a private in Company K, 8th Indiana Infantry Regiment and then in Company F of the 11th Indiana Infantry Regiment where he was promoted to corporal. His brothers Clinton and James M. Young enlisted in the Union army as well. The Youngs also had another brother named John C. Young and a sister, Mary (Molly) E. (Young) Jones. Ransom Young married Nancy Emma Hutchinson on January 26, 1864 in Miami County, Indiana.

Following the end of the war, Ransom and Emma Young moved to Farmington, Dakota County, Minnesota, where they lived until they staked a land claim in Hutchinson, Minnesota in 1866. They had several children, including Elma P., Cecil F., Rebecca A., and Glenn.

Biographical Note

James E. Briggs was born in March of 1827 in Tennessee. He later moved to Clark County, Indiana where he married Mary A. Johnson (February 1833-March 26, 1915) on February 19, 1852. They had three sons, Charles R., James N. and Thomas Edward Briggs, and lived in Utica, Indiana where Briggs worked as a farm laborer.

James E. Briggs volunteered to fight for the Union during the American Civil War in the 12th Battery, Indiana Light Artillery with family and friends from Utica, before he was sent home for illness or injury.

Mary had two brothers who also enlisted in the Union army--Daniel N. (Company D, 23rd Indiana Regiment) and Willis I. Johnson--as did James E. Briggs' brothers, Henry, who served in the 12th Indiana Battery at Chattanooga, Tennessee, and Francis Briggs.
