

Methamphetamine Lab Cleanup: Financing Available

Indiana is leading the way in closing illegal meth labs and setting the standard for cleaning them up.

According to Indiana's new public database, more than 9,000 meth labs incidents have been reported since 2007... with 1,797 occurring in 2013 alone. Most of these labs operate in residential areas where they endanger people's health, cause substantial property damage and threaten communities.


