

A MESSAGE FROM OUR HEALTH OFFICER

Your local health department does more than vaccinate and test as reflected in this annual report. We provide a wide range of services focused on improving the health and safety of those we serve along with providing necessary vital birth and death records.

The Sars-CoV-2 pandemic has focused new attention on public health. Governor Holcomb's Public Health Commission has identified multiple areas that need focus and funding to improve the health of Hoosiers. Indiana ranks in the bottom quartile nationally in smoking, obesity, mental health, and childhood immunization. Life expectancy in Indiana has fallen and has not kept pace with that of the life expectancy nationally. This is bad news for the health and welfare of all Hoosiers but also economically for the State of Indiana. The prospect of higher health care costs is a disincentive in the recruitment of business to our state. State funding for public health in Indiana ranks 45th in the nation. Public health spending in Indiana before the pandemic was \$55 per person and was far short of the national average of \$91 per person.

The Montgomery County Department of Health is funded primarily by local county tax dollars and a smaller fund through the State of Indiana. We provide the services noted in this report with just seven full-time employees. Governor Holcomb has proposed an additional \$30 per capita in funding from the state to each local health department. This represents a dramatic increase in funding.

These funds, if approved, can be directed to the areas of most need in Montgomery County under the oversight and direction of our local Montgomery County Board of Health appointed by our county commissioners. These funds will allow us to increase services and programs for many of our areas of need including mental health, substance abuse, infant mortality, lead exposure,

sexually transmitted infections, childhood immunization, and obesity. As one of the few accredited health departments in the State of Indiana, the Montgomery County Department of Health is well positioned to improve the services we provide through good stewardship of resources provided to us for the benefit and health of residents.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR HEALTH ADMINISTRATOR

As the Montgomery County Health Department came into 2022, we continued to test and vaccinate for Covid-19. Thanks to our staff, volunteers, and community partners, we were able run these clinics and testing sites as well as maintaining our customary level of service in other areas of needs.

In March of 2022, the Health Department relocated to the facilities previously occupied by Williamsburg Nursing Home. This move has been beneficial on several levels. We are now conveniently near other government offices, the location is just minutes from the center of town and provides ample parking. The increased size of the facility allows the Health Department to expand as the scope of our core services increase in number and size.

Because of the previously mentioned support of our community, our community partners, and the dedication of our hard working staff, the Montgomery County Health Department was recognized as the 2022 Community Organization of the year.

There have been many continued challenges throughout 2022, but the Montgomery County Health Department has risen to meet the challenges as they have occurred. We look forward to a future of continued service to our residents as we strive to anticipate the constantly evolving needs of our growing community.




FOODS: INSPECTIONS




MCHD works with the community by providing septic information and assisting in the process of inspections and permits.

Total of babies born to women who live in Montgomery County








Total number of home births in Montgomery County

The MCHD Water Laboratory provides testing for swimming pools, drinking water, and beaches. The MCHD Water Lab tests water samples for E. Coli and Coliform bacteria.





MCHD provides two vaccine programs for immunizations.

The first program, Vaccines for Children (VFC), provides immunizations for individuals 18 and younger.

Qualifications for the VFC program include: Medicaid No Health Insurance Underinsured

The second program, Adult 317, provides immunizations for adults 19 and older.

Qualifications for the Adult 317 program include: No Health Insurance Underinsured

Private vaccines are utilized for individuals who have Private Insurance.


