Food Protection Program

Environmental Health is responsible for the following regarding Retail Food Establishments:

- Routine Inspections
- Licensing
- Plan Review
- Temporary Inspections
- Farmers Market
- Complaint Investigations
- Food borne illness investigation, education, and prevention

Retail food establishments were routinely inspected during the calendar year of 2022.

It is the goal of this program to conduct at least one retail food inspection per establishment per year. However, some establishments with larger, more complex menus require two to three inspections per year. If critical violations are noted during an inspection and cannot be corrected on site, a follow up is conducted to assure compliance with the Indiana Food Code. Critical results of food inspections are published in the Sullivan Daily Times and on the Sullivan County Health Department website.

All complaints related to a retail food establishment are investigated promptly after receiving the complaint. The Sullivan County Health Department encourages the public to be interactive with this office and report any conditions that appear to be unsafe practices.

Residential On-Site Sewage System Program

The environmental division oversees the permitting and inspection of residential and commercial on-site sewage disposal systems or septic systems. This program includes the system requirements being established from soil evaluation reports provided by Indiana Registered Soil Scientists, inspection of the site prior to plan approval, approval of plans for the system and a final inspection of the sewage system to determine proper installation and compliance with the Indiana On-Site Sewage Systems rule. The table below distinguishes the type of permits completed and issued in 2022.

Vector Control Program

Vectors are insects, ticks, rats, mice, birds and other animals that transmit disease-producing organisms to humans. To prevent the human disease and discomfort caused by these vectors, the Sullivan County Health Department provided a community-wide mosquito control program during the summer of 2022. Adulticide is sprayed regularly in highly populated areas during the evening hours of mosquito breeding season. This program is the result of the findings from the Indiana State Department of Health. The Indiana State Department of Health staff identifies hundreds of specimens of insects and other pests each year. They also conduct surveys for mosquitoes and ticks to detect the presence and significance of potential disease vectors associated with the improper storage, handling and disposal of tires, improper waste disposal and natural conditions. The Sullivan County Health Department joined the Sullivan County Recycling Center in a Tire-Take-Back program in the spring of 2022.

Complaints/Other

The Sullivan County Health Department receives and fields many public complaints such as animal control, rental home conditions, abandoned homes, trash build up, mold, standing water, city sewer backup's, etc.

The Sullivan County Health Department will continue to field questions and complaints within local municipalities and will assist with clear understanding of who is responsible for particular actions.


