## DOCUMENTATION OF ELIGILIBILTY REQUIREMENTS:

- SELF- With acceptable identification
- CHILD- With acceptable identification
- PARENT- With acceptable identification along with a copy of your birth certificate
- <u>GRANDCHILD</u>- With acceptable identification along with mother or father's birth certificate naming grandparent
- <u>SIBILING-</u> With acceptable identification along with a copy of his or her birth certificate showing that they have at least one parent in common
- <u>SPOUSE-</u> With acceptable Identification and must provide proof of marriage (current, joint bank statement, taxes, mortgage)
- <u>GRANDPARENT</u> With acceptable identification along with birth certificate of self and parent
- <u>LEGAL GUARDIAN</u>- With acceptable identification along with guardianship papers (with seal)
- S<u>TEP-PARENT-</u> With acceptable identification and must provide proof of marriage (current, joint bank statement, taxes, mortgage) or signed authorization from legal parent
- <u>ATTORNEY-</u> With acceptable identification and direct Interest spelled out on letterhead or court documents
- <u>STATE/FEDERAL AGENCIES</u>- With acceptable personal identification as well as work identification with direct interest spelled out on official letter head, court documents or signed authorization from client
- <u>SOCIAL AGENCY-</u> With acceptable personal identification as well as work Identification with court appointed documents or signed authorization from client
  - Once 75 years have elapsed after date of birth or death distant relatives (aunt, uncle, cousins, etc.) can also receive certified copies with identification.
