

## **Indiana Monthly Medicaid Enrollment 2020 - Current**




## **Current Status**

- As of April 2023, regular determinations of coverage have begun again and actions to adjust, reduce or eliminate coverage are being allowed
- States have 12 months to initiate renewals for their Medicaid population, and an additional two months to finish up renewal processing
- We will process roughly 1/12 of our total renewals each month
- This plan will allow us to manage the workload and ensure we are able to do outreach and follow up as each month's group comes due for their renewals and is processed




## Federal Public Health Emergency Medicaid Redetermination Efforts

The continuous enrollment provisions that Indiana Medicaid has been following since March 2020 ended as of March 31, 2023.

for individuals due for redetermination on April 30th






## **April Redetermination Actions- Summary by the Numbers**

- Redetermination packets sent out: March 17, 2023
- 157,688 members due for redetermination
- 65,092 successful renewals (40,752 of these were auto-renewed)
- 39,057 individuals received text messages
- 15,176 outbound calls made
- **16,624** emails sent






