Adult Mental Health Habilitation State Plan to be renewed Oct. 1, 2023

The Indiana Family and Social Services Administration (FSSA) Office of Medicaid Policy and Planning (OMPP) and Division of Mental Health and Addiction (DMHA) are renewing the Adult Mental Health Habilitation (AMHH) State Plan benefit.

The renewal will reapply the AMHH programming and services for an additional five years. The AMHH serves individuals and their families, or groups of adult persons, who need help on a regular basis with serious mental illness or co-occurring mental illness and addiction disorders. This is accomplished by assessing individuals' needs and strengths and development and implementation of person-centered care plans.

The following services are included in the AMHH State Plan benefit:

- Adult day services
- Home- and community-based habilitation and support services
- Respite care
- Therapy and behavioral support services
- Addiction counseling
- Supported community engagement services
- Care coordination
- Medication training and support



These services can be implemented to ensure individuals receive the care they choose and are connected to and can remain living in their communities.
