Atlas quality measurement system for addiction treatment facilities enrollment deadline is June 30


The Indiana Health Coverage Programs (IHCP) reminds providers that the open enrollment period for the Atlas[®] quality measurement system for addiction treatment facilities is now open. The deadline to enroll is **June 30, 2023**.

All certified providers in Indiana were notified via email of Atlas open enrollment when it began in April 2023. If you have not received information about enrolling or have any questions, please contact Dr. Abigail Mercer, director of State Engagement at Atlas at <u>amercer@shatterproof.org</u>.

Atlas assesses the delivery of best practices at addiction treatment facilities and makes this information available to the public in an easy-touse, trustworthy <u>website</u> to empower patients and their families in locating the addiction treatment that is best for them.

The data and metrics are also available to participating treatment facilities through passwordprotected portals to use for quality improvement efforts, as well as to payers and states to inform the allocation of resources and align incentives with best practices.

A provider's enrollment in Atlas shows their commitment to transparency and quality



improvement. If your organization does not enroll, your facility will be displayed, but with "NO DATA" known. The IHCP would prefer to help consumers understand all the quality services each provider offers, so they can make the best-informed decision.

The goal is for Atlas to create increased transparency about substance use disorder (SUD) treatment services, drive ongoing quality improvement in SUD treatment and guide consumers toward higher-quality, higher-value treatment options. All programs are encouraged to be among those high-quality treatment programs represented in Atlas.

Atlas, a part of the national nonprofit organization Shatterproof, will be in 14 states (including Indiana) by this fall, enabling almost half of the United States population to access life-saving help through this platform.
