What is stormwater runoff?

Stormwater runoff occurs when precipitation from rain or snowmelt flows over the land. Hard surfaces like driveways, sidewalks, and streets prevent stormwater from naturally soaking into the ground.

Why is stormwater runoff a problem?

Stormwater picks up debris, chemicals, dirt, and other pollutants from surfaces. It carries them into a storm sewer system or directly to a lake, stream, river, wetland, or coastal water. Anything that enters a storm sewer system is discharged untreated into the waterbodies we use for swimming, fishing, and providing drinking water. The excess runoff from impervious areas can also contribute to flooding problems.
